# Vigo, Spain

**1st Stop, 20th May 2027**

## **Best Things to Do in Vigo Spain.**

Vigo, a vibrant coastal city in Galicia, Spain, is best known for the stunning Rodas Beach on the Cíes Islands, fresh Atlantic seafood (especially oysters), and historic sites like Castro Castle. Key activities include hiking for panoramic estuary views, exploring the old town (Casco Vello), and enjoying museums like Naturnova.

## **Top Things to Do in Vigo:**

**Visit the Cíes Islands:** Take a ferry to this protected archipelago to visit Rodas Beach, famously named one of the best in the world by The Guardian.

**Explore Castro Castle (Monte O Castro):** Walk up to this 17th-century fortress for panoramic views of the city and Vigo Bay, surrounded by gardens.

**Wander the Casco Vello (Old Town):** Discover narrow streets, local shops, and traditional cafes, starting near the cruise terminal port.

**Eat Seafood in Pedra Street:** Experience Vigo's famous seafood, particularly the local oysters, at the restaurants in the city center.

**Relax at Samil Beach:** The city's main beach, perfect for sunbathing and strolling, popular for its promenade and views.

**Stroll Parque de la Alameda:** A beautiful park in the city center known for its botanical gardens and fountains.

**Visit Museums:** Explore maritime history at the Verbum Museum or sea life at the Museo del Mar de Galicia.

**Walk the Ensanche District:** Visit the modern part of town for shopping, art galleries, and the Real Club Náutico de Vigo to watch the sunset.

## **Must-Try Local Experiences:**

Sample local Albariño wine paired with mussels or octopus.

Take a guided tour to learn about Vigo's maritime culture

## **Port to Town**

Vigo port (Estación Marítima) is directly adjacent to the city centre and the old town, making it an easy 5-10 minute walk for cruise passengers. The area is very walkable, though steep, leading from the pier up to the town's main streets, shopping areas, and the historic old town.

# Cádiz, Spain

**2nd Stop, 22nd May 2027 - Arrive 0700, Depart 17.00**

## Top Attractions and Activities

**Cádiz Cathedral (Catedral de la Santa Cruz):** A magnificent 18th-century cathedral with a golden-tiled dome, offering panoramic views from its towers.

**Tavira Tower (Torre Tavira):** Visit this watchtower to see the Camera Obscura for a unique 360-degree view of the city.

**Roman Theater (Teatro Romano):** Explore the ruins of one of the largest Roman theaters in Spain, dating back to the 1st century B.C..

# Almería, Spain

**3rd Stop, 23rd May 2027 - Arrive 1000 - Depart 18.00**

**Almería** offers a blend of desert landscapes and Mediterranean beaches, highlighted by the massive Alcazaba fortress, the unique cathedral, and free, high-quality tapas with drinks. Key activities include exploring the Tabernas Desert, hiking in Cabo de Gata-Níjar Natural Park, visiting the whitewashed town of Mojácar, and enjoying local history at the Plaza de la Constitución.

## **Top Things to Do in Almería:**

**Explore Historic Sites:** Tour the Alcazaba, a sprawling 10th-century Moorish fortress, and the 16th-century, fortress-like Cathedral of Almería.

## **Experience the Tapas Scene:**

Enjoy the local tradition of receiving a free, substantial plate of food with every drink ordered in bars.

## **Visit the Tabernas Desert:**

Explore Europe's only desert, home to Oasys MiniHollywood, where many Western films were shot.

## **Discover Cabo de Gata-Níjar Natural Park:**

Kayak, snorkel, and relax on stunning, rugged, and uncrowded beaches.

## **Wander Old Town (Casco Antiguo):**

Walk through the Plaza de la Constitución, once the center of public life.

## **Explore Nearby Towns:**

Visit the white-walled town of Mojácar or the coastal village of Carboneras.

## **Learn about Local Culture:**

Visit the Museo de Almería for archaeology or look for the "Indalo" symbol, a prehistoric, protective cave painting symbol from the area.

The Port of Almería is located very close to the city center, approximately 1 km to 1.5 km away, making it a 15–20 minute walk or a 3-minute drive. It is highly convenient for pedestrians, with many attractions, such as the Alcazaba and the old town, within walking distance.

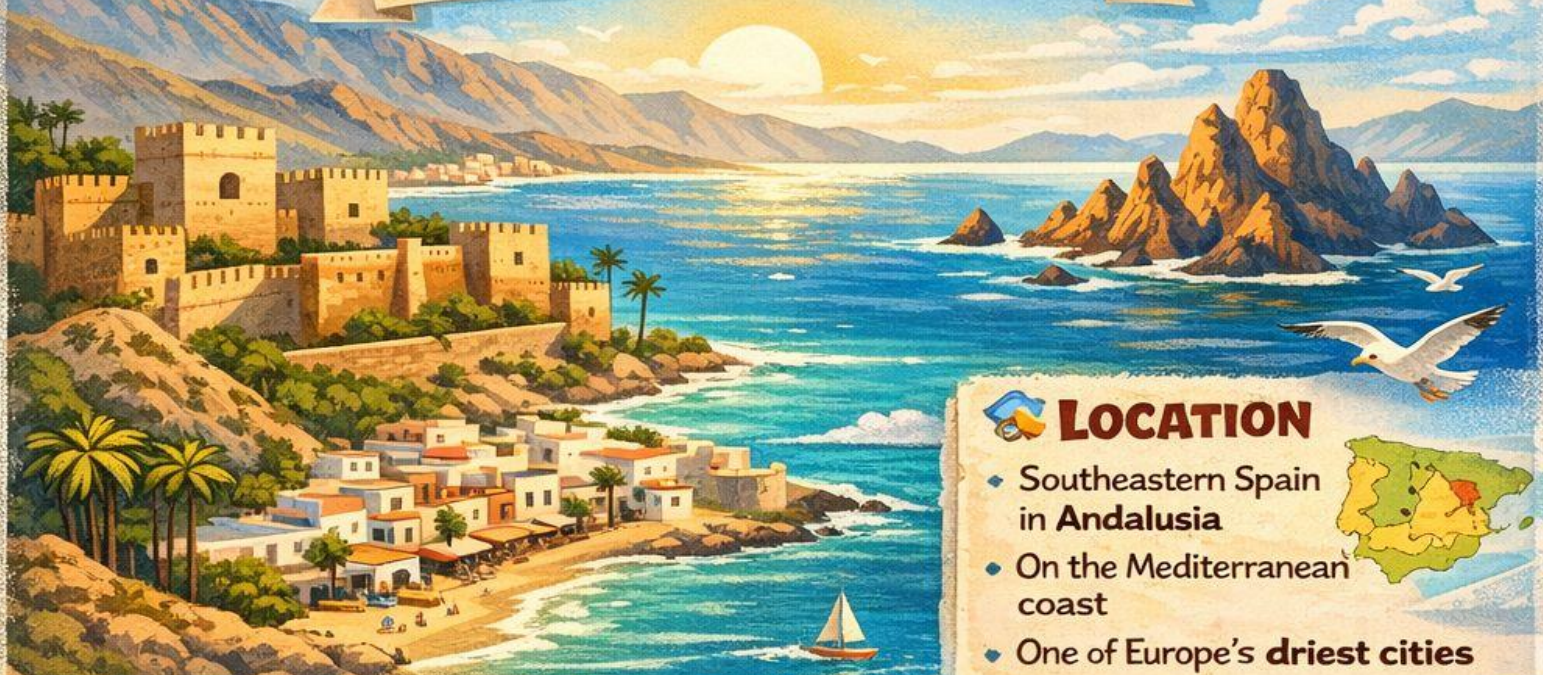

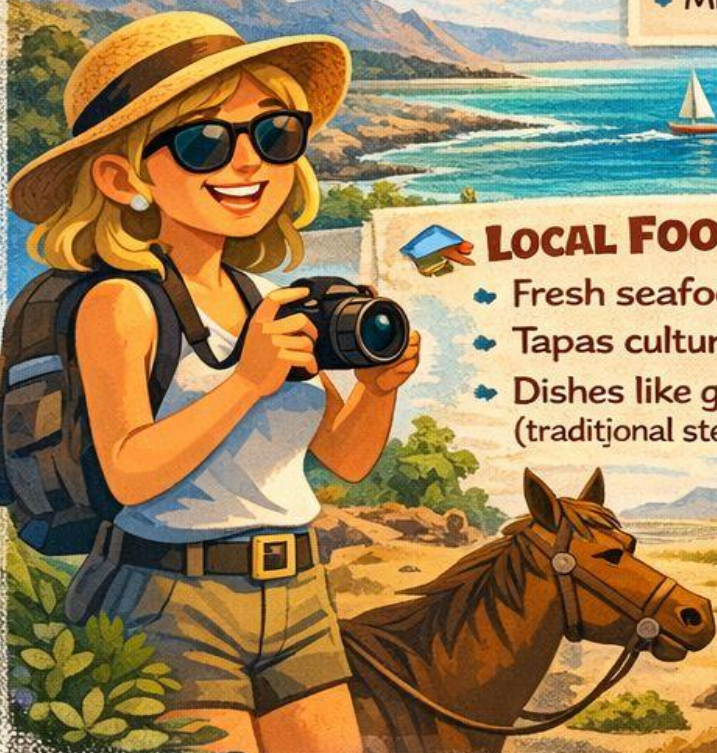

Top things to do in Gibraltar include exploring the Upper Rock Nature Reserve to see the famous Barbary macaques, visiting St. Michael's Cave, taking the cable car for panoramic views from the Skywalk, and touring the Great Siege Tunnels. Visitors also enjoy dolphins watching tours, duty-free shopping on Main Street, and relaxing at Catalan Bay.

**Upper Rock Nature Reserve:** Home to the macaques at Apes' Den, the Windsor Suspension Bridge, and spectacular views, this reserve is a must-see.

## Port to town

The Gibraltar cruise port is located at the North Mole, approximately 1 mile (about 1.6 km) from the town center (Casemates Square).

It is a flat, 15 to 25-minute walk, though shuttles and taxis are available at the terminal, which take roughly 5–10 minutes to reach the town.

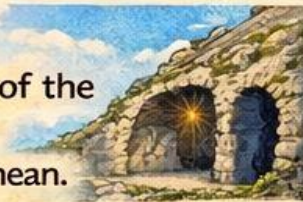

# Honfleur, France

**7th Stop, 29th May 2027 - Arrive 06.00 - Depart 14.30**

**Honfleur**, a picturesque Normandy harbor town, is best experienced by strolling the historic Vieux Bassin (Old Harbor), visiting the 15th-century wooden Saint Catherine's Church, and exploring art at the Eugène Boudin Museum. Visitors can also explore the Lieutenancy, walk through the Jardin des Personnalités, and enjoy panoramic views from the Notre-Dame-de-Grâce chapel.

## Top Things to Do in Honfleur:

**Vieux Bassin (Old Harbor):** Admire the tall, narrow, slate-covered houses that surround the 17th-century harbor, lined with cafes and restaurants.

**Saint Catherine's Church:** Visit France's largest wooden church, built by shipwrights, which features a ceiling that looks like an inverted ship's hull.

**Eugène Boudin Museum:** Explore works by Eugene Boudin and other Impressionist painters who were inspired by the town's unique light.

**Notre-Dame-de-Grâce Chapel:** Visit this 17th-century chapel on the hill above the town to see votive offerings and enjoy panoramic views of the Seine Estuary.

**Explore the Town Centers:** Wander through the cobblestone streets of the Enclos (old town), passing the Greniers à Sel (salt warehouses) and the Lieutenancy.

**Naturospace:** Visit this indoor tropical butterfly house, which is one of the largest in France.

**Jardin des Personnalités:** Walk through this garden dedicated to artists, explorers, and notable figures from Honfleur's history.

**Satie Houses:** Discover the birthplace of composer and pianist Erik Satie, which is now a musical museum.

**La Mora:** View the museum dedicated to the construction of William the Conqueror's flagship.

**Market Day:** Visit the traditional market, held on Saturday mornings, which stretches from Place Sainte-Catherine to Cours des Fossés.

**Promenade de la Jetée:** Stroll along the jetty to see the lighthouse and the sea.

**Unique Experiences:** Sample local cider, calvados, and Normandy cheeses.

Take a boat trip from the harbour for a different perspective of the town and the Pont de Normandie.

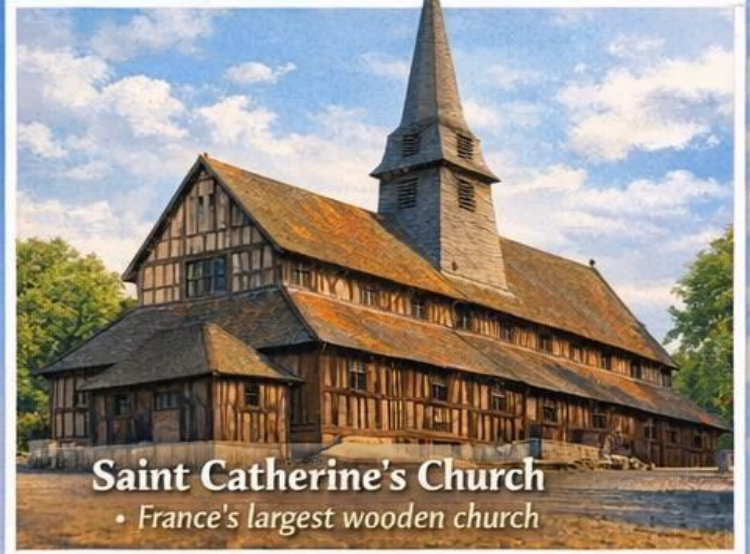
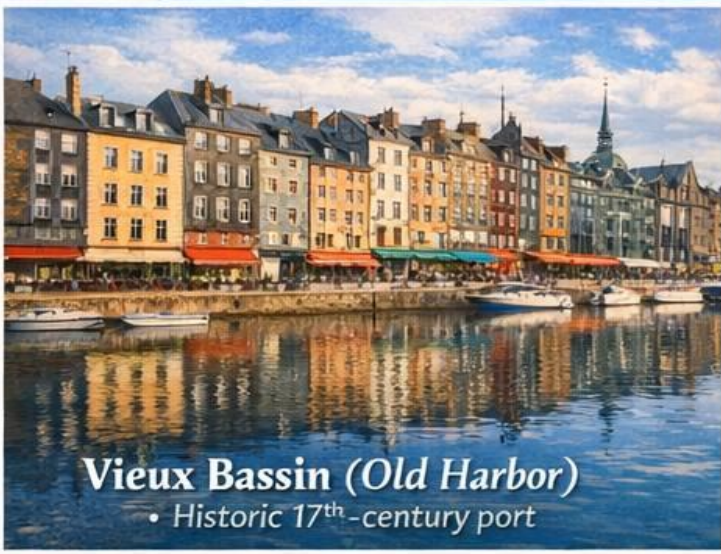
